Tomonori Nochi received his PhD degree on mucosal immunology from Tohoku University Graduate School of Agricultural Science in 2005. He belonged to Institute of Medical Science in the University of Tokyo from 2005 to 2009 and Center for AIDS Research in the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill from 2009 to 2013 as a post-doctoral fellow. Since 2013, he has served Tohoku University Graduate School of Agricultural Science as an associate professor. Since 2015, he has also served the International Education and Research Center for Food and Agricultural Immunology (CFAI) in Tohoku University Graduate School of Agricultural Science as a unit leader, and the International Research and Development Center for Mucosal Vaccine at the Institute of Medical Science in the University of Tokyo as a visiting associate professor. His research interest is to study mammary gland environment for the development of mastitis prophylaxis.
