"An Analytical Foundation of the Classical View of Long-Period Prices with Differential Profit Rates" The uniformity of the profit rates has been intuitively justified by the assumption of free capital mobility across sectors. However, classical economists allow for profit rates differentials also in case of absence of barriers to entry, because of specific factors affecting the investment behaviour of producers in industries. A linear multisectoral model is analysed in which differential profit rates are determined by such "idiosyncratic" factors. The model provides also a rigorous foundation of the uniformity of the profit rates in the long-run.
